Additionally present was Uwe von Lukas. In his speech on Monday, he drew attention to how well the idea of the OTC had been obtained thus far. He highlighted that the OTC was now ready to support the BSPC's efforts in advancing renewable ocean energies and removing ammunition from the grounds of the Baltic Sea. Both topics had previously gotten special attention from the Baltic Sea Parliament Youth Forum.

The conclusion was that good technical solutions are ready and now it is time to start implementing them. We will continue to carry this message into the political arena.

We could not complain at all about a lack of attention. In several official speeches, whether by Minister President Schwesig, Minister of Economics Meyer or Mrs. Lührmann (Minister of State for Europe & Climate at the Federal Foreign Office), the OTC was mentioned as an important development.
